

From the Pastor's Desk

The New Roman Missal

It hardly seems possible that we have been adjusting to the New Roman Missal for some twelve weeks now and for the most part I am grateful that the transition is going quite well. I suspect that as predicted the clergy are having greater difficulty, certainly this is true for me. I guess that this should not surprise anyone for most of the significant changes are truly embedded in the texts the presider is to pray. Our prayer at liturgy is not only intended to be that which we speak or sing.

As we embrace the Lenten Season I would like us to begin to appreciate and focus on the fact that the New Roman Missal also calls upon us to use our bodies in our prayer. *"The gestures and bodily posture of both the Priest, the Deacon and the ministers, and also of the people, must be conducive to making the entire celebration resplendent with beauty and, noble simplicity, to making clear the true and full meaning of its different parts, and to fostering the participation of all."* [General Instructions of the Roman Missal] GIRM #42

I have in the past reminded the community that the *"Diocesan Bishop, the prime steward of the mysteries of God in the particular Church entrusted to his care, is the moderator, promoter and guardian of the whole of liturgical life."* GIRM #22

As such our own bishop has called for uniformity in our posture. We are now asked to stand at the invitation of the presider before the Prayer over the Offerings and we remain standing throughout the Eucharistic Prayer and after the Lamb of God. Because we are standing during the Eucharistic Prayer all are encouraged *"to make a profound bow when the priest genuflects after the consecration."*

Now, a word about this. I have noticed that some folk bow at the elevation during the consecration. The instruction is clear. *"He (the priest) shows the consecrated host/ the chalice to the people."* The intent is that the people will look at what is 'shown' and then bow in adoration as the priest genuflects.

The other times we are asked to use our bodily posture in bowing as part of our prayer is during the Creed when we get to the words of the 'Incarnation,' and when we approach Holy Communion for the Lord's Body and the Lord's Blood. Thus we bow, the minister says *"The Body/Blood of Christ"* and as we take it to eat or drink we acclaim our *"Amen."*

I pray that these instructions prove helpful to us all as we continue to embrace the New Roman Missal and through it deepen our appreciation of the sacred rites that we pray in fidelity to the Lord's command.
